## RACE UPDATES

## Glendambo

2430km form Darwin

Nuna passed in here at 9:05am, Aurora at 10am, and MIT at 10:14am, so Nuna is 55 mins ahead of Aurora. Today's battle is to reach Adelaide, and Aurora will need to average $92.1 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ from here to make it in 4 days, and also to beat Nuna's 2001 record. There is only 568 km to go, and the weather is very fine; no wind at all. We're also hoping for no cloud in Adelaide!

## Port Augusta

2719 km from Darwin, leaving only 279 km to go!

Nuna looks set to make a new record. They reached Port Augusta at 12:18pm, Aurora arrived 75 mins behind them at $1: 33 \mathrm{pm}$, and MIT a further 18 mins behind at $1: 51 \mathrm{pm}$. So since Glendembo we have extended our lead over MIT by 4 mins. MIT had some bad luck entering Port Augusta where they locked up their brakes at a traffic light and damaged two tyres, which they then had to replace before reaching the check stop.

We aiming to reach Adelaide by tonight, and if we want to get there by 5 pm , we will need to average $94 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$, and to get there at $5: 09 \mathrm{pm}$, still within the last race record, we will need to average $89.5 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$.

The weather has been perfect - clear skies, no wind and not too hot. We heard that the rain and cloud in Adelaide has cleared up so we're giving it a go!
